You'll leave with effective communication tools to support prevention, education, and follow-up, including best practices for travelers visiting friends and relatives abroad.

Learning Objectives

- Implement evidence-based strategies for post-travel health care.
- Recognize and describe management for common tropical dermatologic conditions in returning travelers.
- Apply age-specific considerations in the care of pediatric travelers, including vaccination schedules, infection prevention, and travel safety advice.
- Identify travel-related health risks in immigrant and refugee populations, and describe considerations required for providing culturally sensitive care.
- Develop effective communication strategies to educate travelers about travel-related health risks, preventive measures, and post-travel follow-up, ensuring clear understanding and adherence to recommendations.
- Describe best practices around caring for clients who visit friends and relatives in their countries of origin.
